In fact, our gratitude is in response to receiving something we weren't too sure about getting, or from an unexpected source, or even something turning out "better than expected". "Does Someone You Love"

Alli comments:

My fiancé has been struggling with alcoholism since he was 19. He had a lot of issues growing up which I think led him to drink. But he drinks to calm down, to forget, and hope the pain will all go away. I can't do it anymore. It's hurting me to see him like this. I've tried to help. I can't.

Gail says:

It has been a turbulent 4 years, I was married to my first alcoholic for 11, and swore I would never do it again. Then I met Randy, sweet, funny... he drank every day, morning, noon, and night. His mother paid for his rent for two years, the day she came to pick him up to take him job hunting and he was naked and trying to jump in the closet to hide from her, she wrote him a letter she was done. But I stayed. He would call me the love of his life, I live in an apartment section 42, I cannot have a felon live with me, so between homeless missions and his

retired Uncle in Kentucky and my place for short stays I thought He would be okay.... somehow he found the \$25.00 a week room, and I have been told he has been buying the big bottle of VODKA, and the place has bedbugs, cockroaches, and fleas. It has a woman... now he is cooking and cleaning for her instead of me. I have to let go. He looks like the Cirrhosis picture on-line. He has been drunk daily for the two weeks he has lived there. He mockingly was telling someone to tell me he loves me over the phone as she was fighting with him and called me. I guess it was all a lie, and I thought he was the love of my life. SAD, I went to church today, and they said Hatred is Heavy, Forgiveness is the only way to go on without hurting yourself. I have prayed to forgive him. Did he love me? Did he use me? Now that he is drinking, there is no point in trying to find out. I am sure he is going to kill himself and it breaks my heart. I never knew I could hate alcohol for what it does to some people. He doesn't even seem to care, I don't understand. He is supposed to be going to school, I wonder how that will go? I loved him so much. He is gone. The \$25.00 room was a better choice than the mission we agreed upon. He is going to die with the bottle in his hand. I am sad.

"Richard" posts:

Hi, my spouse drinks and say's that's what he loves. I love doing things at church. He compares the two. He stopped for 18 months and it gave me false hope. At times I feel it's my fault and I don't want to leave him, for who else will care?

"Sharing Jesus"

Marilyn M. comments:

There is overwhelming evidence all over the internet that Bill in particular may have called himself a Christian, but he did not live that way. I know less about Dr. Bob's life but I do know that anyone can call themselves a Christian. God has recently convicted me that as a Believer I can no longer participate in arenas where people are teaching that you can choose your own God. That is idol/pagan worship.

If you look at the roots of early AA meetings, they came from the Oxford Groups which were indeed true Believers in Jesus Christ as the one true living God. They shared their "program" of living by prayer and faith and their format for group discussions with Bill and Dr. Bob. By the time their "methods" were officially incorporated into AA, Jesus had been erased. Ask yourself: what does it do to your relationship with God when you participate in teaching others that it's OK to choose your own God? It is against everything you believe, if you truly believe in the deity of Jesus Christ and the words he spoke.

The enemy LOVES "the god of your understanding". He has perverted the Oxford Groups' teachings and mixed just enough truth into AA to soften and disguise the lies.

He who was seated on the throne said, "I am making everything new!"

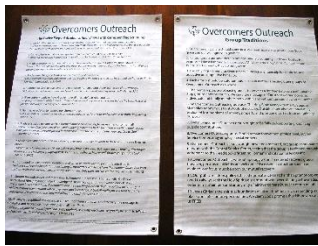
Revelation 21:5

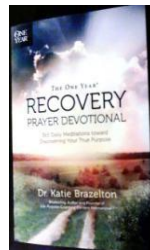

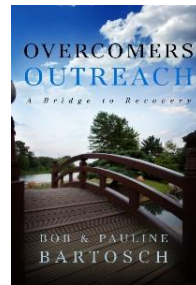


Our [Steps and Traditions Guidebook](#)
