### **Office News**

### **Literature**

By request, the booklets "12 Steps and Standards Guidebook" and "Group Traditions Study Guide" are available once again for group or individual study of the steps and traditions. These booklets are \$3 each. Both are incorporated in our "Steps and Traditions Guide" as well. We have revised and/or updated just about all of our 24 pamphlets, adding 11 new ones as well. Through our pamphlets, booklets, and other literature, we offer our method of recovery, namely faith in and the discovery of God's wisdom for us as shown in the Bible and the 12 Steps. Literature sales help support the office. Other items, such as our key tags for celebrating certain milestones in recovery, are available as well. There you can "look over" our brochures and publications. We also carry Life Recovery Bibles, Christian devotionals, and our "big book" *A Bridge to Recovery*.

### **"What We Do"**

A typical day at the Central Office usually starts pretty early, often before 8am (if someone is near the phone). Calls come all hours of the day, 7 days a week, usually asking for information about groups, placing orders for materials, or looking for help. We are not a 'hotline', nor are we trained counselors, but we can direct people to contacts that may be able to help, so we make many referrals. When a phone is in use, voicemail receives all messages, which are answered as soon as possible.

Between the calls (which seem to come in "clusters"), much of our email, surface mail, and faxes require timely responses. Most of the group literature and supplies are ordered online, as are most of the communications to and from the various groups around the globe.

During any given week, we may have several projects, such as literature development, event planning and coordination, fund raising, speaking engagements, or other outreach efforts that entail some research and face to face meetings. We also have reports to prepare for the Board of Directors and the filings with both state and federal agencies in order to maintain our non-profit status. Add to this our website maintenance and optimization, various payroll reports and filings, ordering and maintenance of inventory and office supplies, the filling, shipping and receiving of orders, bookkeeping, and, most importantly, prayer time – we think you get the idea. Our "staff of one" plus a weekly volunteer

(and others as needed) are kept pretty busy. All of this is done to serve the groups and individuals that represent Overcomers Outreach, to help them be a bridge to those who suffer as we once did.

Requests for information on starting new groups, improving attendance, and directory changes to group listings are being received more frequently both by phone and online.

The opportunity to talk with so many of our wonderful group leaders and members from all over the world is a great blessing. The uplift and encouragement I receive during many of these conversations is amazing, and they always come at "just the right time"! I am equally humbled when I get to talk to someone reaching out for help! Often a word of hope, a suggested contact, a moment of prayer, or a sympathetic ear is all that is needed to start someone on the path of recovery in Christ.

God uses us all to express His love among us, and both your personal gifts and the group's 7<sup>th</sup> tradition donation allow us to continue this ministry. One-time, monthly, and birthday donations can be made online via the website, mailed in, or phoned in, and are all tax deductible. Group 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition donations can also be made in the same manner. Thank you all, and all praise is to Him.
